

It's Partly Up To You

Our great desire is that you will keep on loving others as long as life lasts, in order to make certain that what you hope for will come true. Then you will not become spiritually dull and indifferent. Instead, you will follow the example of those who are going to inherit God's promises because of their faith and endurance.

(Hebrews 6:11-12, NLT)

A question that comes up in church conversations about Scripture and theology is how a believer can know they are saved. Let me attempt to simplify the discussion.

"Eternal Security" is a term that assures us, "once saved, always saved." We need to be careful. This term describes the power of God to save people. When He bestows eternal life, no one can take it away from them. You can be secure in the knowledge that God will keep all His promises, especially the promises of salvation.

Let's look at John 10:27-29 as an example. Jesus promised that He would give His "sheep" eternal life. He said twice that NO ONE can snatch them out of His hand. When the gift of salvation is bestowed, it cannot be taken away. The greatest portion of the gift of salvation is God's prior work on our behalf; we can be assured we are secure for eternity because of Him.

I call the other side of this issue "Temporary Insecurity." This is uncertainty that we've received salvation. This insecurity comes from different things but never comes from the word of God or the Holy Spirit.

God does not want us to live our lives feeling uncertain about our salvation. Since the problem is ours, the cure for Temporary Insecurity lies with us.

First, focus on God and His complete reliability, not on yourself. Learn and trust the unconditional promises of Scripture.

Second, choose to live in a way that proves to yourself first, then others, that you have received salvation. This is where our text in Hebrews 6 comes in. Read it again. It plainly says a purpose for LOVING OTHERS is to MAKE CERTAIN your HOPE will come true. Being assured of your salvation by your own experiences, you avoid being SPIRITUALLY DULL AND INDIFFERENT. Those words describe someone who's lost HOPE, not confirmed it. Having hope leads to greater FAITH AND ENDURANCE.

Occasional doubts or worries are normal (Paul had them; see 1 Corinthians 9:27). Recurring uncertainty about salvation is a situation needing healing. Take the two steps outlined above to journey toward the spiritual confidence God wants you to have.
