#### After a Fond Farewell, a Warm Welcome

At the end of two lengthy letters that attempted to address all the problems a sadly divided church had experienced, Paul made one last call to unity:

Finally, brothers, good-by. Aim for perfection, listen to my appeal, be of one mind, live in peace. And the God of love and peace will be with you. (2 Corinthians 13:11)

We are looking at reopening our sanctuary for worship on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>June 7</u>. As we consider that, let us take a moment to apply these Spirit-inspired words to this unique moment in the history of our church.

#### AIM FOR PERFECTION

In our preparations for Reunion Sunday we are aiming to do everything we can to make our meetinghouse safe for worshipers. Of course, "perfection" cannot be defined as making everyone happy or inspiring universal confidence. That's simply not possible when dealing with human beings. Instead, the "perfection" at which we aim will be the most sanitary environment that can be achieved by what we know about the coronavirus.

#### LISTEN TO MY APPEAL

In this case, my appeal to all of you, is to allow one another the freedom to make their own decisions about whether or not to attend worship. Each of us has our own situations, our own convictions about the virus, and what constitutes "safety" in this pandemic. Each of us has a faith-perspective that informs our decision on this issue. We will respect everyone's decision and will not attempt to persuade or argue with anyone.

#### BE OF ONE MIND

In this situation there are particulars on which most, if not all, of us can agree. Our focus should be on these things, not distracted by things on which we disagree.

- God is with us. He is King over all creation. Our lives are in His hands.
- Worship is essential to our discipleship.
- God created the Church for shared worship, discipleship, stewardship, witness, and service.
- None of the aforementioned ministries including worship - have to occur within church walls.
- Each person is be free to make up their own mind about attending worship in person or online. Both options are acceptable in God's sight.
- Taking reasonable precautions to reduce or eliminate health risks is good and godly wisdom.

#### LIVE IN PEACE

Worry (anxiety) is a denial of God's sovereignty, perhaps even His existence. Worry does not add a single hour to our lives (Matthew 6:27). Indeed, it detracts from all the hours of our lives. Worry is contrary to inner peace and wrecks peace between persons.

The least helpful member of a team is the "Monday Morning Quarterback." Each of us needs to be careful to affirm and encourage everyone's ability to make their own choices. Obviously, that's impossible if no choices are offered.

Do these things and THE GOD OF PEACE WILL BE WITH YOU. There's a promise worth working toward!

# WHEN ATTENDING WORSHIP AND OTHER MEETINGS AT CHURCH, PLEASE OBSERVE THESE SOCIAL SAFETY GUIDELINES

- Observe social distancing of six feet or more. When greeting, do not exchange handshakes or hugs. Do not sit near anyone not of your household. Many pews will be closed off; do not sit there.
- If you wish to wear a mask, you must bring your own. Masks will not be required nor will they be offered.
- If you wish to wear gloves, you must bring your own. Gloves will not be required nor will they be offered.
- Offerings will be brought to the front. (Persons unable to walk up front may raise a hand to be assisted by an usher.)
- When Communion is served, everyone is invited to come forward to be served. (Persons unable to walk up front may raise a hand to be assisted by a deacon.)
- Avoid touching your face except with a tissue.
- Sneeze or cough into a tissue or your elbow.
- Wash your hands or use the sanitizer dispenser before entering the sanctuary and when exiting.
- There will be no Fellowship time after worship.
- After worship, leave the Bible and/or hymnal on the seat to indicate someone sat there.
- If you are ill for any reason, please stay home and worship with us online. A cough or other symptoms may make your fellow worshipers uncomfortable, even if they are not COVID-19 related.
- The nursery is closed. Parents are asked to provide their own child care and toys/materials.

### Our Next Steps - Reopening Our Church

(UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE, this is how we are conducting meetings and services at our church. Because the future is so uncertain, we are not calling these "permanent" **or** "temporary" changes. It will be some time before our "new normal" can be identified, so the following items are open to change. Your constructive input is always appreciated.)

**MIDWEEK MEETINGS:** All midweek meetings are moved are moved to Thursdays. Starting Thursday, June 4<sup>th</sup>, our midweek schedule is as follows:

- 9:00 am = Nehemiah Prayer Group
- 10:00 am = Adult Bible Study
- 6:00 pm = Adult Bible Study

**SUNDAY MORNING WORSHIP:** <u>Starting June 7<sup>th</sup> at 9:30 am</u>, we will have worship together. Note the following:

- Video worship will be recorded at that time and offered on our YouTube channel. The video worship is going to be an ongoing part of our ministry.
- We will not observe Communion in June, but we will take the Deacons' Fund Offering.
- We ask those attending to observe the Social Safety rules on the other side of this announcement
- The key word is GRACE. We are giving one another grace to make our own decisions about attendance. We all have our own opinions and no one understands your own situation as well as you do.

#### **DIGITAL MINISTRIES:**

- As stated above, video recordings of worship will continue to be offered on YouTube. This is both an outreach and a ministry to persons who elect to not attend worship in person.
- We offer a Daily Prayer sent via Call-Em-All. You must contact the office to opt into this calling group. These calls go out at 7:00 pm every day (except Saturday) and last no longer than two minutes.
- You can join our online study of the Revelation any time. Unlike an inperson group, these lessons are recorded and can be watched at your convenience. Contact the office to get your copy of the study. A new video is offered on our YouTube channel every Wednesday.

# Investing in Futures: Providing a Pathway to Success for Indigenous People of Southwest Oklahoma

ne Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) funds awarded by American Baptist Home Mission Societies on behalf of American Baptist Churches USA helped to launch "Bridging the Equity Gap," a component of the

Southwest Oklahoma
STEM Alliance (SOSA), to
engage young people in
educationally-based science,
technology, engineering
and mathematics (STEM)
curricula related to future
professional opportunities.
The students who participate
in this initiative experience
an educational immersion
above and beyond the
standard curricula, as all of
them attend under-resourced



schools. The goals are long-term student development with reduction of adverse childhood experiences.

SOSA is a network of tribal, state, district and school representatives, including national STEM, kindergarten through 12th grade and higher education organizations that are committed to student success through school, community and parent engagement as well as innovative educational opportunities. The Bridging the Equity Gap partnership project provides resources to further the mission of SOSA by supporting the formation of alliance-based youth outreach and coordination activities. The vision and mission of SOSA are aimed at providing interdisciplinary curricula, state and nationwide collaborations, and peer mentorship that provide pathways for not only career success but also student well-being and lifelong learning.

The Bridging the Equity Gap initiative "helps support the overall SOSA mission of bringing small entities together to coordinate resources, procure new resources and build strong pathways to career opportunities and quality of life for students," says David Sullivan, project director. "The opportunity to provide our students' voices to this work is vital and potentially life transforming."

Through this initiative, high school-aged students are introduced to the science of energy sources and transformation. They tour wind farms, participate in wind and solar power demonstrations, and learn about circuit design, hydroelectricity and additional forms of green energy.
