#### What can I do?

I have had the privilege of giving invocations at city council meetings in both of the last two communities in which I've lived. It makes me proud of my faith and my community to serve as a bridge between church and community. Since my job is prayer and prayer is the most important thing we can do, I believe I am contributing to the success of the meeting and the prosperity of the community. I consider this duty to be a fulfillment of what Paul wrote to the church in Thessalonica:

I URGE YOU, FIRST OF ALL, TO PRAY FOR ALL PEOPLE. ASK GOD TO HELP THEM; INTERCEDE ON THEIR BEHALF, AND GIVE THANKS FOR THEM. PRAY THIS WAY FOR KINGS AND ALL WHO ARE IN AUTHORITY SO THAT WE CAN LIVE PEACEFUL AND QUIET LIVES MARKED BY GOD-LINESS AND DIGNITY. THIS IS GOOD AND PLEASES GOD OUR SAVIOR, WHO WANTS EVERYONE TO BE SAVED AND TO UNDERSTAND THE TRUTH. (1 Thessalonians 2:1-4)

Last month we tried to reason out the difficulties facing our nation by the aggressive actions of people who push government as the solution. What they have wrought in twelve months is staggering. But, as I said last week, the outcome is in the Lord's hands. We need not worry a bit. This month I want to impress upon you that our best, most powerful response to all situations is to pray. Prayer is our most important contribution to the community and culture in which we find ourselves. Consider what Paul wrote:

- FIRST OF ALL puts prayer in perspective; it is the thing of primary importance.
- The scope of our prayers have no limit, as we are to PRAY FOR ALL PEOPLE.
- The subject of our prayers is to ASK GOD TO HELP.
- Whether we are of kindred minds on individual issues or not, we are to INTERCEDE for them in prayer, giving THANKS to God for them. Wow!
- A special subject of our prayers is ALL WHO ARE IN AU-THORITY. If we understand AUTHORITY to be "influence," then there are going to be quite a number of authority figures who are the subject of our prayers. We may pray for God to bind the influence of evil doers and to loose the influence of good and godly leaders.
- There are two acceptable motives for this kind of prayer.
  - One, we pray for them to benefit ourselves:
    SO THAT WE CAN LIVE PEACEFUL AND QUIET
    LIVES. Those who practice this prayer and
    lifestyle will be known in the community as
    possessing GODLINESS AND DIGNITY.
  - o Two, for a divine blessing of this practice of prayer; it IS GOOD AND PLEASES GOD OUR SAVIOR.
- This kind of prayer support advances the will of God, WHO WANTS EVERYONE TO BE SAVED AND UNDERSTAND THE TRUTH.

The physical appearance is not what shows our beauty. It is the soul walking with God. Christian's voices need to reflect God as much as the souls walk with God. To see that we all need to be cognizant of our words, the way we look at each individual person and the way we treat one another.
