This is Your Final Warning

This means that God's holy people must endure persecution patiently, obeying his commands and maintaining their faith in Jesus. And I heard a voice from heaven saying, "Write this down: Blessed are those who die in the Lord from now on. Yes, says the Spirit, they are blessed indeed, for they will rest from their hard work; for their good deeds follow them!" - Revelation 14:12-13

In John's Revelation, these verses follow a passage (14:1-5) that depicts God's faithful people on Earth; the 144,000. This section precedes a description of Jesus' Second Coming as a harvest of humanity (14:14-30). What we find in the middle (14:6-13) is a last call to wicked, unbelieving folk to repent, and a final encouragement to the godly believing folks to stay the course. We need to acknowledge both potentialities.

Vs. 12+13 are addressed to GOD'S HOLY PEOPLE. By contrast, the unbelieving people are those who BELONG TO THIS WORLD (v. 6). They must FEAR GOD and repent before God's WRATH falls on them and their worldly institutions (BABYLON) are utterly destroyed.

GOD'S HOLY PEOPLE are instructed to ENDURE PERSE-CUTION PATIENTLY and obey God's COMMANDS. These are two ways their works demonstrate their FAITH IN JESUS, which is to be maintained until He appears in the clouds (Acts 1:11). God sets a high standard for His followers: PERSECUTION is not merely to be endured but endured PATIENTLY! There is no allowance for bitter complaints muttered through gritted teeth. We are to follow the example of the Apostles who *rejoiced* to suffer for the name of Jesus (Acts 5:41-42). Also, as you "keep on keepin' on," be sure to obey God's COMMANDS.

There are seven blessings given in Revelation. The blessing in 14:13 is two-fold: those who endure and obey can expect to REST from the HARD WORK of doing these two virtues, and their GOOD DEEDS will be memorialized for eternity. Notice the emphasis is on Jesus' followers' actions. Having correct theology is essential, but it is not rewarded here; HARD WORK and GOOD DEEDS are. We do good works because we are saved, not to be saved. We do good works because we've been encouraged to expect an eternal reward for having done so. We do good works to distinguish ourselves as GOD'S HOLY PEOPLE, separate from those who BELONG TO THIS WORLD.

TRAINING PASTORS IN MALAYSIA

Aaron and Valerie have a ministry in theological education in partnership with Sabah Theological Seminary (STS), a historic International Ministries partner in East Malaysia. "We have a heart to encourage and equip the local church," Valerie says. "The students here are pastors and future church leaders with a call that has been affirmed by their churches. They've been sent by their churches, and they will return to serve their communities."

Both Aaron and Valerie are trained as theological educators, and they work in pastoral training of primarily indigenous students in both English and Bahasa Malay across multiple levels of education. Their active participation in all aspects of seminary life also includes leadership in pastoral care family groups, and discipling and mentoring pastors as they assist in local church ministry.
