#### THE HUMMINGBIRD STORY ...

Once there was a great forest fire. All the animals fled to the edge of the forest and froze in fear not knowing what to do. They watched as the flames began destroying the beauty of their home.

Finally a tiny hummingbird flew to a body of water and took a few drops into its beak. It then flew quickly toward the fire allowing the drops to fall on the roaring flames. Over and over the tiny bird continued. Drop by drop. Back and forth. Again and again.

The other animals watched from the edge of the forest, and called to the little bird, "What are you doing?" The hummingbird replied, "I am doing what I can."

How often we can become overwhelmed by fear or the sheer size of problems and become paralyzed to do nothing. Or we may compare ourselves to others and feel too small to matter.

Small. What we consider to be small and insignificant may actually be huge in God's scheme of things. Have you ever noticed how often God's view and the world's view are opposite? The world says, "Be first!" God says, "Be last." The world says, "Go, go, go!" God says, "Be still." The world says, "Bigger is better!" God says, "Small is important."

The widow giving her offering of two small coins in Luke 21:1-4 was affirmed by Jesus when He said she had given more than all the rest. Jesus went on to say in Luke 16:10, "He who is faithful in a very little thing is faithful also in much."

In God's hands, small can become big just like in John 6 when a boy's lunch of five loaves and two fish became enough to feed over 5,000 and also have leftovers!

This little hummingbird story can remind us to do what we can. Everything we do for the Lord Jesus matters. It counts!

With you on the journey...

And let us not neglect our meeting together, as some people do, but encourage one another, especially now that the day of his return is drawing near. (Hebrews 10:25)

"I don't need to go to church; I can worship God anywhere" is an excuse we have heard repeatedly from folks eager to justify their absence from Sunday morning worship. Since the pandemic has beset us and most churches have made their services available online, we have more options for non-attendance. A spectator's view of worship has never been more available.

However, Hebrews 10:25 and the witness of all the New Testament point to the irreplaceable requirement (and benefit) of MEETING TOGETHER. Worship is more than an assembly of spectators to witness a performance; it is a MEETING TOGETHER, a joining of spirits, a communion of believers that can only be achieved by meeting in person. Situations may require a person's absence, but this is not ideal and should be temporary.

The primary purpose of worship is to put God front and center. The secondary purpose of worship is what we do for one another before, during, and after worship: ENCOURAGE ONE ANOTHER. This matter of encouraging each other was made powerfully apparent in a recent study of Acts 11 where we were introduced to the Master Encourager Barnabas. We learned that everywhere Barnabas went, he encouraged people of faith. He spread joy and churches benefitted from his ministry of encouragement.

This fact of church life takes on increasing importance as we sense the day of Jesus' return DRAWING NEAR. Are you increasingly concerned about the state of the world? Do you find yourself thinking more often about Jesus' Second Coming and praying it might be today? If so, then you need to be increasingly involved in encouraging other believers. You have more, not fewer, reasons to be face to face and heart to heart.

What response can we give to the excuse offered earlier? Try these: "How do you worship God? Does anyone else benefit from your worship? How about the rest of us? Do you realize we don't get along as well without you? Your presence makes a difference; you'll do more good to worship the God of truth, not just the nature He created. Join us for worship at church." Think of worship this way: we are not only to attend to be encouraged, we are also to encourage others to attend.
