



Ephesians 4:29

Don't use foul or abusive language. Let everything you say be good or helpful, so that your words will be an encouragement to those who hear them.

I have been encouraged to note that the Bible has a lot to say about encouragement. No surprise – it's all positive! Encouragement is a command, not an option. Believers are to be active encouragers, purposely looking for ways to bless others.

The purpose of encouragement is not simply to create a good feeling, though that is its first effect. The purpose of encouragement is to create courage. Courage is what's needed to mature our faith, to enable trust in God, and to become a more assertive witness to our faith. Courage expands our spirits; fear contracts them. Courage expands our social circle, fear restricts it. Courage leads to an adventurous and joyous life; fear limits our experiences to the familiar and “safe.”

Courage has obvious benefits to relationships. The more encouragement we give one another, the more proficient we become in relating to one another. This leads to a wider circle of relationships and greater satisfaction with our relationships.

Encouragement cannot be given with FOUL OR ABUSIVE LANGUAGE; such words detract from relationships. All the sins of the tongue are FOUL and ABUSIVE, not just cursing. Use speech to give courage, not inflict fear.
